One of the foremost world-renowned experts on elephants is the late, great Dr. Dame Daphne Sheldrick, who died in 2018 in her beloved Kenya, Africa. Today, her adult children run her Kenyan elephant and wildlife sanctuary named the *Sheldrick Wildlife Trust*. Their elephant orphanage has provided science with critical information on elephant intelligence and emotions. During her lifetime, Dame Daphne Sheldrick wrote a dissertation on 'Elephant Emotions'.

ELEPHANT EMOTIONS

By Dr. Dame Daphne Sheldrick

Elephants possess the greatest human traits and almost none of the bad traits.

What happens to the babies? Like a human infant, an elephant baby cannot survive without the loving care of its mother. Orphaned African Elephants are succumbing in droves to starvation, grief and death. All the elephants that are under two years old when their mothers are killed will die unless they are rescued. Why is it that most people feel such empathy for elephants, even if they have never had close contact with them? Is it because of their size, their quaint characteristics, or the fact that they are so incredibly endearing as babies, tripping over little wobbly trunks that seem to serve no useful purpose other than get in the way? Or is it, perhaps, because elephants are "human" animals in terms of emotion, and in many other ways as well, encompassed by an invisible and mystical aura that reaches deep into the human soul in a mysterious way that defies human logic.

Elephants are highly intelligent and emotionally sentient creatures

that experience many of the same emotions we do. They are known to grieve for their dead, to carry the tusks of dead family members to another place, to cover corpses with branches, to mourn deaths for a long time. They have been seen to weep tears of sorrow, the only other animal besides humans to do so. Baby elephants are forever traumatized by the horrific killings they have seen and the grief of losing their mother and herd.

With the killing frenzy that has overtaken them, their whole society is collapsing. All the older male bulls have already been killed for their tusks, leaving no father figures for the sons. Young, traumatized males often go on the rampage and attack human communities. Now, the ivory poachers are targeting the matriarch of the family (the eldest female member) – the core of the family group in whom resides all the wisdom, knowledge and experience that must be passed on to the young, such as where to look for water in times of drought, where to find food, how to look after their young. Poachers exploit the tight family bonds of elephants – they shoot a baby first, which causes the herd to gather around to protect it, and then they mow down the entire herd.

I can vouch for that, for I have worked intimately with elephants for 55 years. My team and I have hand-reared over 150 orphaned elephant babies to date, some from the day they were born. I have known them intimately through infancy and childhood into their teenage years - and even well beyond. For like us humans, some elephants like to stay in touch with those they love.

Every elephant we rear is returned back to the wild where it rightly belongs - to lead a normal elephant life back amongst its own kind, to









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cover vast distances in enormous elephant strides, enjoying the companionship of others, fulfilling all the tasks in life that elephants were designed to do such as modifying habitats to trigger wildlife's cyclic and eternal rhythms between grasslands and scrublands essential to the long-term survival of grazing species as well as browsers.

During my long association with the orphaned elephants, many have chosen to remain in touch with the human family that replaced their lost elephant family, and whom they love as deeply as their elephant peers. Many have brought their wild-born babies to share them and their joy with their human family, and some have made sure that their babies are born right close to their former human family so that everyone can experience the joy of their arrival. Many have also returned to seek the help of their human family when wounded or sick. All our orphaned elephants return to a normal elephant life in the Tsavo National Park in Kenya, which is a protected area the size of Michigan State, and as such can offer an elephant the quality of life it deserves.

Whilst it has not always been so, it is now accepted scientifically that elephants share with us many human traits. For instance, they have the same span of life, (three score years and ten, all being well) and that they develop at a parallel pace so that at any given age, a baby elephant duplicates a human of the same age. Their brain is four times the size of ours and convoluted, indicating that elephants can reason and think. It has also been proven that the part of an elephant brain responsible for memory is far more sophisticated than that of

a human. They share with us a strong sense of family, and they also share with us a deep sense of death. I know that they grieve, and they mourn, just as we do at the loss of a loved one, and that they shed tears and suffer depression. They have a sense of compassion that projects beyond their own kind and can extend to other species in distress. They help one another in adversity, miss absent loved ones, and when you know them really well, you can see that they even smile when having fun and are happy.

Each elephant is a unique individual, just as are we, and each has its own unique personality. They can be happy or sad, placid by nature or more volatile. They can even be playfully mischievous, delighting in playing harmless pranks on other members of the family or herd. However, they are taught discipline from a very young age by their senior matriarchs. They know envy and jealousy, can throw tantrums and harbor grudges about a perceived injustice, just like human children. And just like human children, they can be competitive for rank and status amongst their peers. This applies to both males and females, for elephant society is complex, where female family units remain united for life, led by the oldest female of the group who is known as the matriarch. Young bulls remain with the female family until puberty, but then prefer the company of other bulls so that they can spar with one another in tests of strength and dominance, often attaching themselves to high ranking and revered adult role models, whom they emulate, and learn from. However, they will always still keep in touch with their female family and visit them from time to





time, but they are the scouts of elephant society, who must be more adventurous and seek out safe havens for their female loved ones. They prefer a more independent existence, for boys will be boys. That said, bull elephants are also very caring of the young.

Elephants are essentially peaceful and peace-loving animals despite their undisputed strength and enormous size. They are also essentially very fearful animals that are terrified of the unknown. Like human children, they are more fearful of the dark, for like us they have limited night vision.

But they have been endowed with many additional attributes that we humans lack such as the ability to communicate over distance using low range sound hidden to human ears.

They can decipher chemical, hormonal messages, and they have a mysterious perception that defies all human logic, able to foresee important events ahead of time.

We have witnessed this time and time again amongst our orphaned elephants.

Animals are more ancient, more complex, and in many ways more sophisticated than man. In terms of Nature, they are truly more perfect because they remain within the ordered scheme of Nature and live as Nature intended. They are different to us, honed by natural selection over millennia so they should not be patronized, but rather respected and revered. And of all the animals, perhaps the most respected and revered should be the Elephant, for not only is it the largest land mammal on earth, but also the most emotionally human.

LAWRENCE ANTHONY

Author of The Elephant Whisperer

South African conservationist Lawrence Anthony devoted his life to animal conservancy, protecting the world's endangered species. He nurtured a wildlife reserve in Zululand, South Africa, named *Thula Thula* game reserve.

In 1999, he received a life-changing call: a herd of seven elephants that were termed 'rogue' and 'trouble-making' had become notorious escape artists, and were barreling their way across sections of South Africa where they were not wanted. The background lives of these elephants explained a great deal. They had witnessed killings of their family members, and the post-traumatic stress was evident in their fight and flight behavioral patterns. These were not elephants at peace. They were permanently in a state of terror. Anthony's knowledge of these facts made him hesitate when he was asked to accept this 'rogue' herd into *Thula Thula*. He was their last chance at survival. If he refused to rescue them, they would be killed. Recognizing the enormity of the task, and the emotional damage already inflicted on these giant animals, Anthony's conscience superseded his logic. He was determined to give them another chance at life.

Upon agreeing to the rescue, before arrangements could even be made, the elephants broke out from their temporary enclosure, and the matriarch and her baby were shot. The surviving elephants in the herd were traumatized and very angry. After Anthony brought them to *Thula Thula* shortly afterwards, they started planning their escape.



Their fight and flight mechanisms were at extreme reactionary stage, and running was what they knew best.

What followed was an incredible journey between Anthony and the herd as he battled to know and understand their behavior. It took years for him to gain their trust, but elephants are enormously sen-

sitive, and even after a few months, they sensed something in Anthony which calmed them down. As he cautiously and respectfully gained their trust, he and they began to form an inexplicable bond. Anthony described that period as one of the greatest teaching lessons of his life in which he learned so much about these sympathetic creatures. As he engaged with the elephants' signals, they taught him about life, loyalty, and freedom. The elephants adjusted to *Thula Thula* triumphantly and proliferated in numbers – always with the knowledge that their other adoptive family member – Anthony – was in close proximity as their friend and protector.

In March 2012 – something powerfully astounding occurred. Lawrence Anthony suffered a fatal heart attack on March 2nd. The elephant herd he had rescued, loved and nurtured were in the Zululand bush - a hundred miles away from Anthony's house at *Thula Thula*. But these wild elephants made a solemn procession for 12 hours – in two separate herds - to come up to Antho-

ny's home to stand vigil around the house - grieving and paying their respects. The second herd arrived the day after the first herd arrived. They stood silently for two days around his bedroom, saying goodbye to the man who saved them. To this day, it is something that science cannot explain. How did they know that Anthony had died?


At Lawrence Anthony's funeral, Rabbi Leila Gal Berner, said these words:

"A good man died suddenly, and from miles and miles away, two herds of elephants, sensing that they had lost a beloved human friend, moved in a solemn funeral procession to make a call on the bereaved family at the deceased man's home. If there ever were a time, when we can truly sense the wondrous interconnectedness of all beings, it is when we reflect on the elephants of *Thula Thula*. A man's heart stops, and hundreds of elephants' hearts are grieving. This man's oh-so-abundantly loving heart offered healing to these elephants, and now, they came to pay their respects to their friend."

Elephants have long been known to mourn their dead in a profoundly deep way. In case any of you might be skeptical as to the relevance of this story, exactly one year after Anthony's death, to the day, the same grieving herd marched to his house – again – to pay their respects.





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


Rihanna Shone Like a Diamond



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Downfall of Power

Cate Blanchett as Lydia Tár

ate Blanchett's brilliant performance as the musical genius, Lydia *Tár*, in this year's 6-time Oscar-nominated film, Tár, is riveting in its portrayal of a supremely gifted human genius who will ultimately fall on her own sword as she fails to read the temperature in the room amidst the power of the #MeToo movement. The tragedy of her own demise is that she is at the pinnacle of her career as the greatest living composer and conductor of the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra. She has earned the coveted word 'maestro' from musicians and critics worldwide – and it is that edified title that will come crashing down as her own behavioral errors escalate into a tsunami of public backlash.

There is nothing more swirling and mesmerizing than watching Lydia Tár (masterfully acted by Cate Blanchett) coax the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra to new heights with her artistic baton – eliciting nuances and exquisite interpretations of music that are spellbinding. But behind the façade is a deeply flawed human being whose insecurities play out in her fabulist stories and her cuttingly condescending

remarks to a student named Max at the Juilliard School of Music. As Tár tries to prove her point about the responsibilities of musical conducting, she chooses Max as her example of a robotic musician who fails to understand the genius of Bach and other famous composers. But Tár fails to read Max's body language as his burgeoning anger towards her escalates, and when he eventually explodes under her public humiliation, she dismisses him as another millennial who's chosen "social media to be the architect of his soul." Her lack of sensitivity at that moment is in complete contrast to the overwhelmingly intense sensitivity she channels towards music and sound.

The contradictions in Tár's behavior become starkly evident as the cracks in her confidence surface more blatantly. While she appears to wield her power with aggressive impunity, replacing people and firing them, Tár's insecurities and basic needs cause her to engage in humiliating behavior in which she becomes an aging sycophant pandering to younger flesh. We see this as she overlooks and offends significantly talented musicians in favor of an attractive young woman for whom she develops a crush. Her verbal language - as well as her body language

- have failed to register the changes in society from the #MeToo movement. She is so punch drunk on power that she is blinded and impervious to the inappropriateness of her words and actions, and her own personal flaws and needs increase the velocity of her downfall.

There are so many clever encapsulating visuals of Tár that highlight her power and her blindness to the world around her. While she sleeps in the luxury of her private jet wearing an eye mask, her assistant is warning her about Krista Taylor, a former student of hers with whom she had an inappropriate romantic relationship, who is sending increasingly more urgent and disturbing texts to her teacher. Tár chooses not to heed the warnings, and instead, allows the disturbing situation to escalate.

Her power comes with an emotional detachment in which she throws out important human nuances that will lead to tragedy. When Tár falls for a young Russian cellist, her behav-

ior is so sophomoric in its immaturity that she fails to recognize that the young cellist is simply using her to earn a place in the prestigious orchestra. Tár never gets on Instagram and doesn't see that the cellist is mocking her on social media. The millennial world of daily public spectacles on IG makes Tár the targeted, surveilled victim and she is oblivious to its ramifications. Tár's domestic partner tries to wake her up to what is happening around her, but her arrogance makes her deaf to the increasing sound around her.

Around an hour into the film, it is revealed that Tár's former student and romantic partner, Krista Taylor, has committed suicide. In typical brusque manner, Tár brushes it aside like a non-occurrence – not registering that suicides are serious acts and that there will be an investigation. When she is brought in for questioning, she denies any knowledge of the texts sent by the suicide victim and corners her assistant into

lying about everything. Additionally, Max, the student whom she humiliated at Julliard, has taken revenge against the maestro on social media by splicing filmed sound bites of Tár's inappropriate language and actions with students. Has Max masterfully manipulated the situation? Yes, because if the filmed episodes were set against the backdrop of words said over a protracted period of time, they would not appear so offensive. But all put together in a short time capsule, they tell a different story.

Despite criticism leveled at Cate Blanchett by some female conductors at what they perceive as her "offensive" interpretation of a gender that has been historically overlooked in orchestral conducting, Blanchett fired back with this comment: "The film and the story are not gender specific."

So, is this a story about the internet, the #Me-Too movement, and cancel culture? Yes, it is partially. It's about the volcanic eruption of a brilliant conducting career because of sexual impropri-




eties, and the abuses of power. Behavior that was tolerated ten years ago is no longer tolerated. A revolution has taken place worldwide in which there are firm checks and balances to ensure that there are no more gray areas in which power and manipulation can flourish. There's a lot of discomfort in society about cancel culture. Many people believe that it's been taken too far and that everyone is now afraid to speak or act in case the *Me Too* police are watching. Tár's life is destroyed and undone by a new world with zero tolerance for behavior that used to be commonplace.

But I view the superb film as much more than Tár's fall from cancel culture. She would probably have fallen sooner than later from many of her human failings. This is a highly intelligent, gifted person for whom life has bestowed much. Her narcissism blinds her to her own shortcomings. Her brilliance could have been used to edify an up-and-coming generation. Instead, she chose to insult her minions with a cuttingly

sharp tongue. She displayed biases and favorites. She destroyed the careers of some of the people she led because she labeled them inaccurately and swept them out of her ambitious path. She was a relentless bully who indulged her own separated-from-reality fantasies. The scene in which she threatens one of her young daughter's classmates - cuts chillingly into one's bones. It's imperiously cruel and unforgiving.

This is a penetrating character study in which Tár's insular world couched and protected her sense of superiority. It became so extreme that she became increasingly blinded to the reality of what was happening around her. Ultimately it was her narcissistic ego that caused her downfall. Cancel culture accelerated the inevitable. The conductor created her own crisis.

Cate Blanchett owns the character magnetically and the film's 6 Oscar nominations endorse why this film is so important.

known treatments include drugs and "deep brain" stimulation, where a neurotransmitter is implanted in the

chest and wires inserted into the brain to electrically stimulate the areas that control movement.

Michael J. Fox, is a fine actor and international celebrity who brought his struggle with this condition to national attention when this bright young man began to demonstrate the slightest of symptoms. On behalf of the thousands of secret sufferers from his condition he went public so the world could watch how the disease worked over time, and how he managed with it. He illustrates hope where there had been none.

While April is Parkinson's Disease Awareness Month, we believe every month should offer an opportunity to spread awareness and raise much-needed resources. We invite you to join us as

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we inspire enthusiasm with our cars and camaraderie for this important cause, and help us to benefit those challenged by this indiscriminate disorder and aid ongoing research efforts to put an end to it.



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




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Short Stories About Big People


I think he could always ask Chris Carter!

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My Dirty Little Secrets For The Tomato Lover

ou're in luck! Late spring through mid-summer is the prime time for planting tomatoes in Southern California's coastal areas. If you are a tomato lover like me, you can't ever get enough of learning about or eating them. It satisfies your stomach and your soul when you grow them yourself. What would life be without home-grown tomatoes anyway?

In my many years of gardening, I have learned from the best of tomato-growing enthusiasts, and have gained many informative tips about growing tangy, delicious, mouthwatering tomatoes. So, I would like to pass on my dirty little tomato secrets from my gardening past to you.

REVIEW ON GROWING TOMATOES

- LOCATION First of all, you need a sunny location. Tomatoes like it hot. They will need at least 6 hours of full sun is even better. Avoid planting near trees with evasive roots. Plant away from large structures on the south side of garden.
- AMENDMENTS It is always good advice to dig at least a 3' deep by 2' wide hole and amend the soil before you plant your seedlings. Adding a mixture of worm castings, chicken manure and organic compost combined with the original soil, will really help your tomato plant's health.
- BABY ASPIRIN Yes, this component helps boost the plant's immune system, just like it does for us. A diluted solution of


aspirin water for plants provides accelerated germination and some resistance to disease and pests. Aspirin in vegetable gardens has been shown to increase plant size and yield.

- **SOFTEN THE SOIL** If you are dealing with clay soil, gypsum is a must. Sprinkle it all over the base of the hole and mix in with other amendments, fertilizer, and soil. Gypsum will break down the clay, making the soil more accepting for the deep roots that your mature tomato plant needs. Gypsum also helps with blossom end rot.
- TOMATO FERTILIZER Fertilizers improve the supply of nutrients in the soil, directly affecting plant growth. Use a high-phosphorus, organic, slow-release fer-

tilizer that is specially formulated for tomatoes – with a NPK ratio like 3-4-6 or 4-7-10. Don't over-fertilize. Too little is better than too much. Tomato plants require enough phosphorus supply to ensure a healthy fruit set. Try Dr. Earth's or EB Stone's Organic Tomato Fertilizer. This is dry fertilizer that should be mixed with soil at the base of the plant, and the quantity will depend on the planting conditions.

- EPSOM SALT Add Epsom salt to the soil to aid germination, early root and cell development, photosynthesis, plant growth, and to prevent blossom-end rot. Late in the season, use an Epsom salt spray to increase tomato and pepper yield and keep plants green and bushy, early in the season.
- AMENDMENTS Soil amendments improve a soil's physical condition. Organic matter added to your garden area increases bulk, nutritional value, and the soil's drainage. A combination of compost, worm castings and chicken manure are good to mix in with your soil. Amend your vegetable garden all year long.
- PLANT THEM DEEP It is better to plant transplants instead of sowing seed because the germination process is long. When planting your transplants, plant them deep. There are little fuzzy beginnings of roots at the base of your plant. By removing the bottom leaves and burying them below the fuzzy root area you will give your plant a stronger immune system. Only put one transplant in each hole. Leave room for your tomato plant to thrive.

- TEASE THE ROOTS Remove the transplant from its pot and gently tease out the roots. You don't want them to grow in a tight circle. Fanning out the roots will help develop a stronger root system, making for a healthier plant.
- SUPPORT YOUR TOMATOES You must anticipate your tomato plant's growth early. Tomatoes grow fast and it is best to be ready before it is too late. For each of my tomato plants I use a tomato cage that you can buy at your local nursery, then I take hog wire that I zip tie together to make a 5' high, 3' to 4' in diameter cylinder. Your plant will look a little lonely at first; but trust

me, once that baby gets growing, it will take all of that real estate and more sometimes!

• NOT TOO MUCH WATER - Tomato plants are really hardy but not if you water them too much. The water drives air out of the soil around the plants' roots, and eventually the roots drown and die. A deep soak a couple times a week is enough once established. Stick your finger into the soil to check if you need to water. Water in the early morning; you want the soil to be crusty before the sun goes down to prevent disease and pests. Once tomato plants begin to fruit and ripen in mid to late summer, cut back on watering to help concentrate the flavors and reduce splitting and cracking.

- LET THEM BREATHE In southern California we have nice warm days and cool nights. That means your tomato plant can get a little chilly and damp at night. Tomatoes get diseases when they are continually wet. It is key to let your tomato plant breathe. To help improve airflow and cut down on the chance of disease, remove the leaves along the bottom 12 inches of the stems of indeterminate tomato plants.
- MULCH Materials added to or laid on the top of the soil around your plants to

further insulate, protect and aid in weed control is called mulch. Hay, plastic sheeting, straw, shredded leaves, grass clippings, bark chips, newspaper can all be used as mulch. Allow a 2" ring around each of your plants. Never put the mulch up against the base of the plant, it will only cause disease.

There is so much more that I want to teach you about growing tomatoes! I could go on and on. I guess I will have to share more of my dirty little tomato secrets in another article. There's nothing like a homegrown tomato! If you were only going to

grow one thing and you asked my advice (from one tomato lover to another), I would urge you to grow tomatoes. They truly do make life more flavorful!

Nature is amazing! Get out there! Embrace and enjoy!





he silver paint that Stephen used is exactly that of his famous Louis Vuitton-style graffiti. In fact, Stephen sent me a postcard – that was our thing back in the 90s – sending each other kitschy cool postcards – and one of them he fashioned extra cool, from a selfie I did on an Instamatic camera at his apartment in New York City. Later, it was turned into a sentimental painting (à la Warhol style – as

Stephen was a muse to Mr. Warhol and it was so fitting). This painting is on the cover of my book, *The Velvet Rose*. I donate a portion of the proceeds from my book to *MusiCares* – a wonderful charity. And of course, I hold dearly the artistic pants forever. The late, great Stephen Sprouse will always live on in my family's hearts. I feel the same way about *Chrome Hearts* – also one of the world's most fabulous designers. They too are family to me."

We talk more about Susan's hugely successful book, *The Velvet Rose*, which was released in 2019. I ask her if the book's fictional character, Scarlet, who embodies much of Susan's own real-life journey in the rock n' roll world, makes the book somewhat autobiographical.

"Oh yes," she says. "I've been told that sometimes, you can tell more about a person's journey through a fictitious novel than an autobiographical one. It's nice that I didn't have to worry about conflict with any loosely based experiences since it is a novel. There were 'no fences' or barriers comparably since it was written in a fiction format. While the hard-cover edition of my book *The Velvet Rose* was published and released in 2019 (right before Covid hit), I am now ramping up for the paperback release and its book tour soon."

I ask Susan for more details on her graduate studies at Harvard.

"I've completed a course at Harvard (graduate-level), and thus far, I've never studied so hard in my entire life! It has exponentially sharpened my writing skills and appreciation for some of the most inspiring Pulitzer Prize-winning authors we embraced and carefully studied."

Susan's gene pool reflects the adage that the apple doesn't fall far from the tree. Her doctorate father is thrice a Fulbright Scholar, and her mother was an English teacher and reading specialist for the San Diego County Office of Education. Her talents and skills are making contributions in many spheres.

"I co-host with Duff a *Sirius XM* show called 'Three Chords and The Truth' where we play the music that depicts the truth in rock n' roll. It premieres every Friday and re-airs every day thereafter. You can listen to it in your car, tv or download the

Sirius app to hear whenever you like. It's also being picked up in other countries for our latest contracts."

There is nothing that Susan does mediocrely. She's a super achiever in the best sense of the word. Her quest is always to accomplish a task with a huge amount of passion, knowledge, and effort. That same diligence is currently being applied to the family's home.

"I have been working diligently on our 1927 English Tudor home for the past three and half years. I've been decorating it and now with superstar interior designer/architect Nicolo Bini for an upcoming major shoot."

We chat more about Susan's charitable endeavors. She's a dedicated supporter of *MusiCares*, a 501°3 charity founded by the Recording Academy in 1989 to safeguard the well-being of all music people through direct financial grant programs, networks of support resources, and tailored crisis relief efforts.

"Being that I travel so much, and my schedule is all over the place," Susan explains, "it's difficult for me to navigate charitable work (i.e., being on a board of a particular charity), so, this is one way of my being able to give back to such an important cause. *MusiCares* has genuinely helped personal friends and many people who give so much to the world with their music. They generously offer preventive, emergency, and recovery programs. They offer a safety net that includes counseling and support for those battling addiction, to HIV/ Aids to Parkinson's disease."

Susan's altruism continues to be evident as she explains her latest activity.

"I recently had the pleasure of choreographing, and teaching models walking the runway for a wonderful nonprofit event for children with disabilities for *United Cerebral Palsy*."

The apple and tree adage is reflected in Susan's and Duff's daughters, Grace and Mae. I ask Susan for an update on their activities and accomplishments.

Grace (25) is continuing her education in college. She also completed her teaching certification for yoga. She is touring (she recently played both the prestigious Reading and Leeds Festivals in the UK) and writing consistently. Mae (22) just graduated with a double major at Parsons School of Design/The New School in NYC. She has already launched her own 'Mae McKagan' collection and both girls model frequently too."

Susan and I discuss the importance of priorities as we accrue wisdom from life experience. She offers this perspective with deep conviction.

I get to wear many hats. I'm a wife, mother to two wonderful daughters, model, Harvard student, Sirius XM host, and now, best-selling author











"Health is wealth. Sleep is extremely important. Exercise often for both the mental and physical benefits. Education! Always continue learning new things! I am currently enrolled at Harvard University where I completed and received an A in my Feature Writing graduate-level first course."

She continues with her top priority list: "Family comes first, and friends are very important. I'm a firm believer in giving back to society and being around positive people and uplifting energy. Being kind to animals and surrounded by nature is so important, and maintaining a creative outlet is good for the soul."

Susan's body is strong and resilient. I ask her how she maintains that strength.

"Thank you so much," she says graciously. "I stretch, breathe, work out, and mix it up. The tactic is to prevent complacency in the muscles by shocking them a bit. One day I'll go for a nice hike and another day, do some weight training or workout videos. I also love the outdoors, so a nice swim, biking, or horseback riding is great too."

As for Susan's earnest wishes for the rest of the 2020 decade, she replies thoughtfully.

"I think we all learned a lot about each other during the global pandemic. Every day is a blessing. I guess, the positive takeaway was to slow down and take more care of ourselves and others. We only have ourselves and one planet earth so we better take care of it and each other."

We move away from philosophical questions to action. I ask Susan about the parts of the world that had the deepest impressions on her in the last 5 years.

"I am lucky to have visited so many extraordinary places in the last five years from going back to my old stomping grounds in Paris (where I lived for eight years), and London is always one of my faves. Some recent standout travels for me are Iceland (The Blue Lagoon), to my very favorite on African Safari, which I highly recommend for anyone who has not had the pleasure to experience as of yet!"

The last time I interviewed Susan, she mentioned that her personal favorite songs from Duff are 'Wasted Heart' and 'Sweet Child of Mine'. I ask her if there are any updates.

"Duff is quite a songwriter," she replies. "Nobel laureate, Bob Dylan, recently wrote how Duff's song 'Chip Away' from his recent solo record called *Tenderness* "has profound meaning for me." Dylan also says he hails it as "a great song" when he was recently interviewed regarding his thoughts on "the philosophy of modern song". Duff has also co-written songs recently for Iggy Pop, Ozzy Osbourne (Duff won his second *Grammy Award*, this one from his co-writing and playing on this Best Rock Record 2023), Daryl of Run DMC, and of course Guns N' Roses."

Food brings families together in such a fundamentally joyous way. Susan agrees.

"Both my daughters are excellent cooks and one of my favorite things is when we all get together and cook a dish of our liking at home for Thanksgiving dinner."

The day after our cover shoot took place, Susan jetted off to Maui on vacation. Her set of organizational skills was strongly evident as she completed one task to perfection - and then caught another flight. A few days later, I asked her about the family's attraction to Maui and she supplied the organic response that I had come to know about her.

"We have loved coming to Hawaii over the years," she says. "It's such a relaxing and gorgeous place. We love it so much that we treated ourselves and bought a place right on the ocean. We love to come here and see our local friends, eat fabulous local food and of course, swim in that stunning ocean. This time we watched the whales spouting all week. It was a thrill."

There is so much to be learned from Susan's life journey. She could have become caught up in the traps of fame, ego, and wealth. Instead, she has chosen to prioritize relationships and love. Her healing grounds are with nature. Even the family's home is rooted in substance. Susan's project is about restoring it to its full historical significance. Architectural brilliance lives on for generations.

Susan concludes by offering this powerfully wise quote:

"Exterior beauty, without the depth of a kind soul, is merely decoration," she says.


She continues: "Work hard and be nice to people. I believe in good karma and always being the best you."

believe in aging gracefully," she used to say but didn't have time to prove it to the end. Her premature passing left us bereft of the chance to watch this magnetic beauty growing old, with the same self-possession and passion with which she lived her life in the tumultuous, fully-exposed, and glorious years

As we belonged to the same generation and cultural background, I always recognized in Tatjana Patitz the European flair that made

her stand out from the crowd wherever she was. Mastering both sophistication and the elegance of refusal, she embodied authenticity in a sea of artifice and vanity, while remaining an enigma to the industry and audience alike. In a strange yet explicable way, I felt heartbroken by her untimely demise.

of her youth.

Born in Hamburg and raised in Sweden, Tatjana was discovered in 1983, at 17, when she placed third in the finals of an Elite Model Contest in Stockholm. She won a trip to Paris and a limited-time contract, but it took until the late '80s for her career to really take off.

It was around this time that she had the magical encounter with German photographer Peter Lindbergh, whose work would be instrumental for her career and for whom she'd model as his beloved muse for the following three decades.

Renowned for his preference for natural beauty and unretouched photos, Peter Lindberg took for Vogue the now-iconic shot of Patitz, together with Estelle Lefébure, Karen Alexander, Rachel Williams, Linda Evangelista, and Christy Turlington, frolicking in their white oxford shirts on the beach in Malibu, in 1988. Lindbergh's photo "White Shirts: Six Supermodels, Malibu" set in motion the Supermodels era and changed forever the way we see fashion.

Two years later, Lindbergh shot the legendary cover for 1990 British Vogue, showing Tatjana Patitz, Christy Turlington, Naomi Campbell, Cindy Crawford, and Linda Evangelista in the streets of New York, in a black and white photo that became a touchstone of the period's glamour photography and launched the fabulous five young models as

the Supermodels. Lindbergh's strong aesthetic, and the sense of timelessness inherent to his images, transformed the women he photographed into heroines of their time, personalities who became supermodels, to later be known only by their first names.

About Patitz, Lindbergh wrote in his book, 10 Women, "I admire Tatjana because she always stays herself. She's very soft, but at the same time she's very strong and knows how to stand up for what she thinks, and it's always very enriching to be with her. It's impossible not to admire her and over the years not to be just a little bit in love with her."

The British Vogue's January 1990 supermodels cover inspired George Michael to invite the same cast to appear and lip-sync in his "Freedom '90" music video. That went down in history like one of Tatjana's best-known appearances, at the height of the MTV era, and put posters with Fab5 on every teenager's bedroom wall worldwide. And then, they walked for the Versace fashion show in 1990, which sealed them as stars who transcended the realm of fashion.

Tajana Patitz went on with a flourishing career, becoming known as well for her work on television commercials, which employed her striking beauty for humorous effect. She had a role in a 1988 Levi's commercial opposite male model Bruce Hulse, which was banned in the UK for the intense sexual chemistry, another one in a 1990 commercial for Stainmaster carpeting, named by Entertainment Weekly one of 1991's best advertisements, and a few film and television roles in the 1990s, most noteworthy in the crime drama "Rising Sun" (1993), based on a Michael Crichton novel, alongside Sean Connery and Wesley Snipes.

She scored more than 130 covers, according to Elite, and appeared in countless major magazines. She marched for luxury brands such as Chanel, Yves Saint Laurent, Versace, Valentino, Ralph Lauren, Calvin Klein, Salvatore Ferragamo, Karl Lagerfeld, Helmut

Lang, Donna Karan, Jean Paul Gaultier, and Vivienne Westwood. During her career, Tatjana Patitz had long-standing working relationships with Peter Lindbergh, Herb Ritts, and Patrick Demarchelier, but she worked with other famous photographers, such as Irving Penn, Helmut Newton, Richard Avedon, Annie Leibovitz, Steven Meisel, Sheila Metzner, Wayne Maser, Gilles Bensimon, Francesco Scavullo, Inez and Vinoodh.

But what made Tatjana Patitz so unusual, so different, so singular?

As she told Vogue in a 1988 interview, "people always said that I looked special; that I didn't look like anyone else. And I was going to make it because of that."

She was indeed distinct from her peers. When they separated the women from the girls, she stood out for her womanly allure, assumed and knowing, never that of a naive ingenue. A true Germanic beauty –

statuesque, edgy, cool, intense, and sinfully seductive, she was a force to be reckoned with and commanded any room she stepped into. The piercing gaze of her dangerously hypnotic blue eyes, which had the perfect combination of fire and ice, gave her the "otherworldly look" widely recognized by the industry.

Photographer Matthew Rolston said of Patitz, in 1990, "There's a depth, an emotional quality in her that's truly extraordinary."

"Her features are a bit off; she's not a typical, commercial beauty, but when I shoot her, I'm never bored. Her looks have power, strength, intensity," said celebrated photographer Herb Ritts.

"It's hard to get a bad picture of Tatjana. She's very photogenic, which is very rare, and she looks different in every light," added photographer Patrick Demarchelier.

"Tatjana was always the European symbol of chic, like Romy Schneider-meets-Monica Vitti," remembered Anna Wintour, global editorial director of Vogue. "She was far less visible than her peers - more mysterious, more grown-up, more unattainable - and that had its own appeal."

Apart from the other original supermodels, Patitz tried to distance herself from the fashion industry. She decided to make her home not in New York or Paris, but in California, where she moved in 1989, at the height of her fame, so she could be closer to nature and her animals. "I always thought



[fashion and modeling] wasn't what I was into; as that was what I was doing. It didn't define me", she said.

A lifelong animal lover, she collaborated for decades with the PETA association and the nonprofit Return to Freedom Wild Horse Conservation. "The horse, to me, represents freedom. My favorite place to see anything in the world is from on top of a horse. I have horses and my passion for horses to thank for staying grounded. I don't know what I've learned from horses, but maybe I've learned everything," she confessed in a video filmed at Return to Freedom Wild Horse by Kurt Iswarienko.

She continued to work in fashion throughout her mature years, but she chose her projects "very selectively," she told Mercedes-Benz's 63Magazine in 2016, seeking to "combine my work as a model with my vocation as a protector of nature and animals."

"Living here and coming back to this place has been like a sigh of relief, in a way,"

Tatjana Patitz said in 2009 to The Guardian, discussing the refuge she found in her ranch in the Santa Ynez Valley, California, and roaming the Santa Barbara horse country's wilderness with her son Jonah, now 19, her "source of happiness."

Her last appearance was in 2019 when Tatjana Patitz walked the runway at Milan fashion week for Etro's fall-winter 2019/2020 show.

Behind the public persona, who traveled the world sometimes on 40 flights a month, there was a woman of extraordinary kindness and exquisite emotional depth. Diana Addison Lyle was close to Tatjana and describes her as "a well-read person who found the need to study life and human behavior; always polite, respectful, kind, courteous and gracious; a woman who never had a vain bone in her body. She was an artist who saw fashion as an art form. Everybody in the industry loved her because they saw something special in her – and aspired to attain that specialness."

Says Benjamin Lindbergh, son of the late Peter Lindbergh, "Tatjana will be remembered for her natural kindness, her inner beauty, and her extraordinary intelligence. My father's work is inextricably linked to her image, a unique combination of understated strength and effortless elegance that inspired him throughout his career." Peter Lindbergh passed in 2019, and Benjamin Lindbergh is the President of the Peter Lindbergh Foundation.

Peering through tens of her photos to choose for this article, I found myself again mesmerized by the magnetism of her lynx eyes, by their inescapable attraction, and asked myself once more, what was the source of her power? Maybe it was the fact that she "never sold her soul," as Patitz said in a 2020 interview.

Or maybe it was that she knew the answer to the oldest mystery in the world – of who we are and what we are to each other, to ourselves, to time.

"I hope you're riding on a horse in endless meadows with that smile on your face and the wind blowing in your hair," Helena Christensen posted to her Instagram

I like to think of her sharing that smile with Peter again, while he captures - as only he knows - the spell of her ethereal grace one last time, not so much with his camera as with the shutter curtains of his heart.

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

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Why Is It Called A 529 Plan?

529 plan, also called a Qualified Tuition Program,[1] is a tax-advantaged investment vehicle in the United States designed to encourage saving for the future higher education expenses of a designated beneficiary. 529 plans are named after section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code—26 U.S.C. § 529.[2] In 2017, K–12 public, private, and religious school tuition were included as qualified expenses for 529 plans along with post-secondary education costs after passage of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act.[3]

Contributions to 529 college savings plans are made with after-tax dollars.[4] Once money is invested in the account, it grows tax-free, and withdrawals from the plans are not taxed when the money is used for qualified educational expenses.[5] A 529 plan can provide a convenient, hands-off way to save for college, but according to the new law 529 plans can be used to fund all K–12 school tuition costs up to \$10,000 per year per child.[6] The SECURE Act further expanded the use of 529 plans to cover student loan repayments.[7][8][9][10]

THERE ARE 2 TYPES OF 529 PLANS:

- Prepaid plans which allow one to purchase tuition credits at today's rates to be used in the future.[11] Therefore, performance is based upon tuition inflation.[12] Prepaid plans may be administered by states or higher education institutions.[13] The prepaid plan allows you to pay for future tuition at current rates, which could mean significant cost savings down the road.[14] Although some states cap the total allowable balance in your account, those limits are relatively generous and range between \$235,000 to more than \$500,000.[15][16]
- Savings plans which are different in that all growth is based upon market performance of the underlying investments, which typically consist of mutual funds and exchange-traded funds (ETF).[17] Investors can select stocks and bonds via preset investment menus.[18][19] Most 529 savings plans offer a variety of age-based asset allocation options where the underlying investments become more conservative as the beneficiary gets closer to college age.[20]

ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES:

The primary drawback of prepaid tuition plans is that they generally apply only to certain community colleges, colleges, and universities within a particular state. 
